Lot No. 1.—All that lot situated in
the County and State aforesaid and
town of Greers, on Emma street, con-
taining 12,000 square feet, more or less,
and being lot conveyed to said George
W. Hughes by L. J. Green, by deed
recorded in R. M. C. office for Green-
ville County, in book F. F. F., page 18.
Lot No. 2.—Situate in the County and
State aforesaid and said town of
Greers, fronting on Emma St., 34 feet
and Trade Street 20 feet, containing
one-eighth of an acre, more or less,
and bounded by lots of C. W. Drace,
L. M. Marchant and lot of said George
W. Hughes on which is situated a
small wooden building, and being the
lot on which now stands a new two
story brick store.
Lot No. 3.—All that lot of land situ-
ate in the County and State aforesaid
and said town of Greers, fronting on
Trade Street 23 feet and running back
100 feet, and bounded by lots of L. M.
Marchant and lot on which said brick
store stands and having a small wood-
en building thereon.
Terms.—One-half cash on day of

months from day sale, said balance
to be secured by the bond of the pur-
chaser and a mortgage of the prem-
